December sales of Series, EE & HH United States Savings Bonds in Colorado County were reported this week to be \$7,150. Sales for the first twelve month period totaled \$121,504 for 71% of the 1980 goal of \$170,000.

Texas sales during the month amounted to \$20,371.87, while sales for the first twelve months of 1980 totaled \$253,614,455 with 91% of the yearly sales goal of \$280 million achieved.
