Sheriff's Department Makes Investigations

Fire, Burglary In New Town; Three Cases Believed Solved

Colorado County Sheriff's Dept. has had another busy week, investigating an assortment of cases ranging from rape to burglary and theft.

Rape Charges

At 1:32 p.m., Saturday, May 23rd, a 24-year-old Negro woman reported to the sheriff's department that she had been raped at her residence in Alleyton. She gave officers the description of a Mexican male, approximately 5 feet, 8 inches tall, about 150 pounds, with a full beard and bushy hair. She stated the subject came by her residence and asked for directions to a local place of business in Alleyton. He reportedly raped her at that time. No threats or weapons were used.

Due to the time lapse from the time of the rape and the time it was reported (approximately 45 minutes) officers were unable to locate the subject. Medical tests were made at the Columbus Hospital and the contents will be taken to Austin to be analyzed.

Burglary, Fire In New Town

At 8:00 a.m. Monday, May 25th Willie Yell of New Town reported his place of business, Rhem's Cafe, had been broken into. Investigation revealed that entry was gained through a broken window on the east side of the building. It was also learned that someone had set a box of cleaning dust on fire inside the place. The Eagle Lake Fire Department was able to respond and remove the burning box from the building before there was any damage.
