Oil, Gas Activities

Oil and gas activity in the county includes a 15,000 foot gas well, the No. 1 Winterman to be drilled by Houston operator Ark Energy Inc. 14.5 miles southeast of Eagle Lake. The drill site is in the G.G. Kelly Survey, where the Houston operator has 621 acres under lease.

Champion Petroleum of Corpus Christi has abandoned a dry hole, the No. 1 Barta Unit, eight miles northwest of Sheridan. The well was located in the Philip Bugler Survey and was drilled to a total depth of 4,920 feet.

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
