Pre-Construction Meet Held On Reflective Markers

A pre-construction meeting was held at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, June 1, 1981 at the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation office in Yaukey to outline plans for placing reflective pavement markers and thermoplastic striping on various highways in District 13.

Tennessee Road Supplies, Inc. was low bidder for this work at \$345,454.50. The 206-mile project has been allotted 45 working days for completion. The contract includes work in Calhoun, Colorado, DeWitt, Fayette, Gonzales, Jackson, Lavaca, Victoria and Wharton Counties.

E. J. Blaschke, Supervising Resident Engineer in charge of construction, said, "The markers to be placed include reflective type raised markers for the centerline stripe,

no-passing zone lines and lane lines for divided highway sections. Thermoplastic pavement marking for centerline stripe, no-passing zone stripe, lane stripe for divided highway sections and edge lining is also to be placed under this contract. These markers and striping are designed to more effectively delineate the traffic lanes at night and during inclement weather in order to provide a greater degree of safe highway driving."

"The lane-line markers for four-lane divided sections will produce a white light reflection for vehicles moving in the correct direction, but will produce a red light reflection for vehicles traveling in the wrong direction," Blaschke said.

Work on this project is expected to begin in early June.

Deer Control Bill For County Fails To Pass Legislature

State Representative Robert Saunders reports that a bill which he sponsored in the past Texas Legislature to remove deer in Colorado County from the State Regulatory Control program failed to pass the Legislature.

Rep. Saunders submitted the Bill to the Texas Legislature at the request of the Colorado County Commissioners' Court in response to petitions signed by over 700 persons in this county to remove the county's deer from Parks and Wildlife Department control programs.

Rep. Saunders said the Bill did not pass mainly due to the position and opposition of Governor Bill Clements. The representative said the governor went on record as opposing any changes taking any wildlife out from under the Parks and Wildlife Department control program. "He believes we have a good
