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Aid Available For Crop Losses Due To Flooding

In addition to price support benefits and deficiency payments, the 1981 farm program offers farmers crop protection against severe weather conditions.

The Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service says that due to the excess rain and flooding in Colorado County, it could affect crop yields. Farmers who accurately reported crop acreages and signed an application for payment under the farm program, will be eligible to receive disaster benefits, if affected and approved.

The program covers low yields and price support (loans) provisions, and offers protection against drought, flood, hail and other disaster conditions.

Farmers should notify the County ASC Office before harvesting or destroying crops or replanting to other crops when a disaster strikes.

beverages containing alcohol or caffeine. Also, there's a small list of "odds and ends" to avoid - dried fruits and frozen fruits or vegetables with sauces or added sugar, and any processed food that has the words "sucrose, glucose, dextrose, lactose, fructose or syrup" written on the label as the first ingredient. When those words appear first, they signal a large sugar content.

In addition, avoid breaded meats.

Low-sugar diets really don't hurt anyone - in fact, the dietary guidelines for Americans consume 130 pounds of sugar every year, much of that in processed foods.

Sugar "Don'ts"
Concentrated-sugar items include pie, cookies, candy, doughnuts, jams, jelly, marmalade, sugar coated cereal, syrup, honey and soft drinks. It's also a good idea to avoid foods, items with cereal fillers and, greased dishes, since they are high in carbohydrates.

Low-Sugar "Do's"
Once you learn the "sugar don'ts", there is no limit to the nutritious creativity you can employ in designing your own special low-sugar diet. Start with fresh fruits and vegetables, canned products without sugar - or even lightly sweetened fruits.

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Rotary Installs New Officers; Hears Fine Barber Shop Quartet

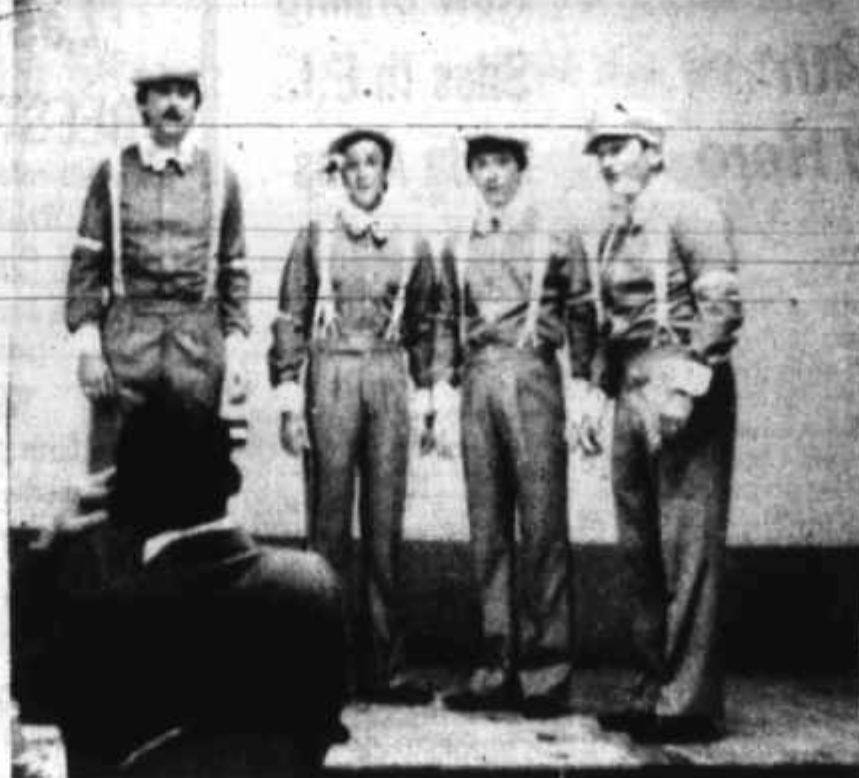
