Do we plan to abandon the millions of dollars of investment in our existing natural gas fueled plants? No, as a matter of fact, gas will continue to be our major fuel for some time to come. But over the next couple of decades we will be making a gradual shift from natural gas to coal and nuclear.

The total of 960-million barrels included more than 661-million barrels of crude oil. Also produced was 29-million barrels of condensate, according to figures compiled by Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association's Colorado County, which has had recorded production since 1932, last year produced 560,384 barrels of crude oil and condensate at the rate of 1,559 barrels per day. Production in 1990 boosted Colorado County's production total through the end of the year to 23,334,983 barrels.
