Fees. All passed unanimously except for the weed ordinance which passed 4-1 with Councilman Alvin Kohleffel voting against on grounds that it was "too drastic."

Final readings of the three rate ordinances and second reading of the building and weed ordinances are scheduled for the July 14th

meeting.

Other Action

The Council also took action on the following items which will be discussed in more detail in next week's issue:

• The council postponed acceptance of the bid for construction of the wastewater treatment plant until the July 14th meeting at which time bids on the rehabilitation of sewer lines will be available. The council was openly critical Tuesday night of the Bernard-Johnson Inc. engineering firm for underestimating total costs of the project.

The firm now estimates total project cost will be \$1,539,616 (which includes \$63,600 for rehabilitation and prospects are this might cost more) as compared to estimated costs of \$1,400,000 made earlier this year. It was noted that of the total cost of the project, over \$350,000 will be spent for engineering fees.

• Also the council approved a plat for Austin Subdivision, a 13.91 acre tract being developed by the Kenneth Austins on the southern edge of the city limits. Eight tracts of from .80 of an acre to one acre will be offered for sale. Mr. and Mrs. Darrell Austin represented the Austins at the meeting. The plat was accepted pending addition of provisions on streets and drainage which are to be placed on the recorded plat.

• Approved closing a block of Walnut Street in front of the Community Center for the Chamber of Commerce Fourth of July festivities from 6 p.m. to 12:30 a.m.

• Approved a holiday for city employees, except for emergency standby personnel, on Friday, July 3rd since July 4th falls on a Saturday.

• Heard City Manager Robert Klockman report on street, ball park, airport and drainage projects. He reported the new fogging machine purchased by the city has arrived and has been used three times and is reported to be operating very effectively.
