**Two Lose Savings In Swindles In Weimar**

[The following story is reprinted from the Weimar Mercury, issue of June 25, and we hope it might be helpful in preventing a similar occurrence here.]

The "Pigeon Drop," perhaps the world's second oldest profession, found two more victims in Weimar during the past two weeks, police Chief Ken Hollas reported.

The more recent case went this way:

An elderly man was approached by a man and a woman on June 11 at the corner of Eagle and Converse streets. They said they had found \$400 and thought they knew who lost it. If he would help them find the owner, he could share in the reward they would get. To show good faith, he would have to put up \$400 of his own money, but there was no risk, for they would wrap up the entire \$800 and put it in the compartment of his car.
