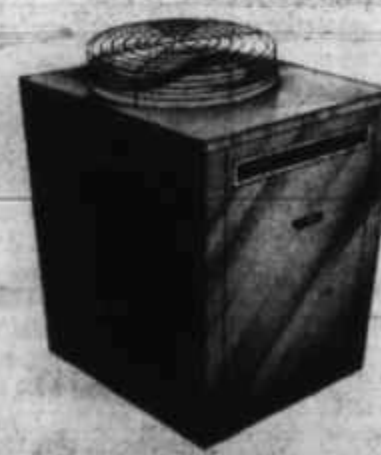

Lynnette Wilcox Is Miss East Fort Bend County

A 1981 Dulles High School graduate and a soon-to-be freshman business major at University of Texas at Austin, Miss Lynnette Wilcox, is the first to wear the Miss East Fort Bend County crown, according to a story featuring Lynnette in the July 1st issue of The Mirror, published in Missouri City.

Lynnette is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas G. Wilcox of Sugar Land and is a niece of Mr. and Mrs. Robert P. Wilcox of Eagle Lake.

She won the scholarship pageant in competition sponsored in February by the East Fort Bend County Chamber of Commerce.

"The Mirror's" story said in part: "It was Lynnette's first pageant. A veteran of more than 11 years of dance studies, Lynnette said she was attracted to the local pageant, as she has been to the national Miss America Pageant with which it is affiliated, by the talent competition."

"Looking back on her brief reign as Miss East Fort Bend County as she prepared for the Miss Texas competition, Lynnette said she did not realize what could be ahead of her when she entered the Chamber contest. Her biggest surprise was the time involved in preparing for the state pageant."

"Lynnette, whose contagious smile and sparkling vitality never seem to leave her, hasn't noticed any particularly dramatic changes in herself or in her relationship with her friends. Although adjustments have had to be made to accommodate her ever-increasingly busy schedule, she said she does not feel awkward with the attention she receives as Miss East Fort Bend County on personal appearances. In fact, she said she 'kind of enjoys it.'"

"Being a pageant winner and title holder 'sometimes makes a difference' in her relationships with peers, but has not caused conflicts with real friendships, Lynnette noted.

"Looking ahead to last weekend's departure for Fort Worth and the start of the state pageant activities, Lynnette said she is still shocked at the thought of herself competing for the Miss Texas title."

"It's scary for me. I've never done anything like this before and I don't know what to expect and what things are really like. But I'll do my best and it will be fun," she said."
