Man Dies In Accident Near Weimar Mon.

Adam Gomez, a 22-year-old Florida man, died Monday morning as a result of injuries received in a single car accident on IH-10 near Weimar.

The accident occurred about 2:20 a.m. on Monday near the Weimar exit on IH-10.

Gomez, according to investigating officer DPS Trooper Gary Eden, was traveling east when he apparently fell asleep and drove onto the median of the Interstate. His car clipped a large light pole, went into a broad-side and then began flipping an undetermined number of times, according to the officer.

Gomez was thrown from the out-of-control vehicle and both he and the car eventually ended up in the westbound lane of traffic.

Gomez, who received severe head injuries in the accident, was transported to the Weimar hospital by the Weimar Ambulance Corps and later Life Flighted to Hermann Hospital in Houston where he was pronounced dead at about 6:14 a.m.

The Weimar Fire Dept. assisted at the scene of the accident by washing fuel and other debris from the roadway.
