Rice CISD School Lunch Prices Are Increased For 1981-82

The cost of school lunches and breakfasts in the Rice School District will be going up in the 1981-82 school year as the result of increases approved by the board of education in session last week.

The increases approved by the board were: adult lunches up from \$1.10 to \$1.35; high school students, up from 75c to \$1.00; elementary and junior high students, up from 65c to 85c; paid breakfasts up from 10c to 30c; reduced price lunches up from 20c to 40c; but cost of extra milk will remain the same at 20c.

Supt. Harold Kirk reminded the board members that the district received a 3c lunch cut back in government funds last December and he is anticipating a further cut back of 8c per lunch.

"We would have lost money in 1980-81 if it were not for the Rice High School's snack bar," said the superintendent. "As it was, we came out in the black by \$171,744."

He added that the recommended lunch prices are a sizeable increase but are in line with most area schools and "are a necessary step to supplement the lunchroom with other funds."

The superintendent and board praised the work of Mrs. Mabel Franklin, director of food services for the Rice District, for her work in keeping the lunchroom program operating as efficiently as possible in order to keep lunchroom prices as low as possible.

With the opening of school on August 26th, Lunches for students in kindergarten through fourth grade will be 80c; for students in fifth through eighth grades, 90c; and for students in ninth through twelfth grades, \$1.00. Reduced price lunches for students in K-12 will be 40c.

The fee for snack bar students will be \$1.00; 20c will be charged for extra milk; and all adult lunches, including the snack bar will be \$1.40.

Schools Are Open - Drive Carefully!!

As the 1981 school year opens, area drivers should give special attention to the rules of the road.

In its annual "Schools Open, Drive Carefully" campaign the Texas Division of the American Automobile Association reminds motorists to be extra alert when driving down neighborhood streets and in school zones. Be on the lookout for children darting out from between parked cars. Many young drivers become excited about the new school year and seeing old friends again. They may tend to forget their safety rules. It is a good idea to review safe walking rules with your children and map out the safest route to school.

Here are some additional tips for a safe school year:

- Observe reduced speed limits posted in many school zones.
- Watch for children riding bicycles.
- Drive your children to school only when it's absolutely necessary. Increased traffic contributes to congestion in school zones. If you must drive your children, find the least congested area to drop them off.
- An important reminder: Drivers are required to stop for school buses that have stopped to load and unload children and to remain stopped until the children are safely across the street and the bus is moving again. This applies whether you are in front of or behind the bus, unless you're separated from the vehicle by a divided highway with a median strip.
- The first weeks of school are the most hazardous, since many youngsters are either attending school for the first time or they are in a different school where they may be unfamiliar with area traffic patterns. All motorists are urged to take special precautions at that time.
