Regular Budget Expenditures

The proposed general budget for 1982 includes the following expenditures: \$29,805.15 for the jury fund; \$24,338.40 for countywide road and bridge funds; \$704,256.00 for precinct road and bridge operation; \$491,297 to the general fund; \$72,050 to revenue sharing general; \$75,000 to permanent improvement funds; \$559,183.90 to officers' salary fund; \$85,000 to interest and sinking funds; \$394,000 to additional ad valorem funds.

The budget is available for public inspection in the county auditor's office on the second floor of the courthouse and in the county clerk's office on the first floor.

Proposed Salary Increases

The salary increases include for the District Clerk and County Attorney, \$17,485, an increase of \$2,880.60; Auditor, County Clerk and County Sheriff, \$18,279, an increase of \$2,485.20; County Judge, \$18,472, an increase of \$2,652 and for serving as juvenile judge, \$24,000, up \$420; Tax Assessor and Collector, \$18,519, up \$2,485.20; County Treasurer, \$12,987.80, up \$1,787.80; and the four commissioners, \$17,362, an increase of \$2,485.20.

Justice of the Peace pay is proposed as follows: No. 1, \$12,475.20, up \$1,627.20; No. 2, \$2,400, up \$1,341.60; No. 3, \$4,612.80, up \$601.80; No. 4, \$3,756, up \$495; and No. 5, \$7,759.20, up \$1,012.20. Constable pay is proposed to be: Nos. 1, 4 and 5, \$907.20, up \$181.40; Nos. 2, 3, 6, and 7, \$594.80, up \$81.20.

The Eagle Lake city council, in session on Tuesday night of last week, OK'd a proposed subdivision within the city limits and is expected to approve contract specifications on the development when it meets in regular session on Tuesday night of next week.
