Suspense And Humor Fill Library At R.H.S.

The Rice High School library has served many new books this past week. Numbered among the new arrivals are fiction, biography, and various subject headings like history, social sciences, science, and applied science.

If mystery is your delight, Helen MacInnes' "The Hidden Target," which is romantic, toughminded, and spellbinding. The novel is set against a background of meaningful present-day events. Chance unexpectedly brings Nina O'Connell and Robert Renwick face to face on a sunny street in Amsterdam. Their last meeting had been in Geneva six years before, a time when Nina, fifteen, thought herself in love with this American army major attached to NATO. There is a sinister and devastating objective - Nina had been chosen for the part she will play - the hidden target. From the first scene - a meeting of conspirators in a church in Germany - to the breathless finale in Washington, the tension builds. As always, Helen MacInnes' novel is clear and swift.

To capture the warmth and charm of the man, the library has an informal anecdotal biography of "Prince Charles." The narrative demon-

Strates how the Prince of Wales has succeeded in becoming a man about whom there are no doubts as to his fitness for the task ahead - future King of Britain. There are over 140 illustrations, over 90 in full color, which give further insight into this hardworking man who is tackling his role as heir to the throne with humor and a high degree of professionalism.

History is captured in Robyn Davidson's "Tracks." In April, 1977, a twenty-seven year old woman set off to cross the rugged bush of her native Australia, accompanied only by four camels and a dog. What does it really mean to pilot one's self against obstacles and odds? Is it even possible now to "shed burdens" - to escape, unencumbered, into the wilderness? Davidson tells us candidly and with very humor the surprising answers she found along the way, helped in part by the wisdom of an Aboriginal elder with whom she briefly traveled. When, six months and 1700 miles of outback later, Davidson and her caravan arrive at their Indian Ocean destination. Her arrival marks the end of a true odyssey and an unforgettable book.
