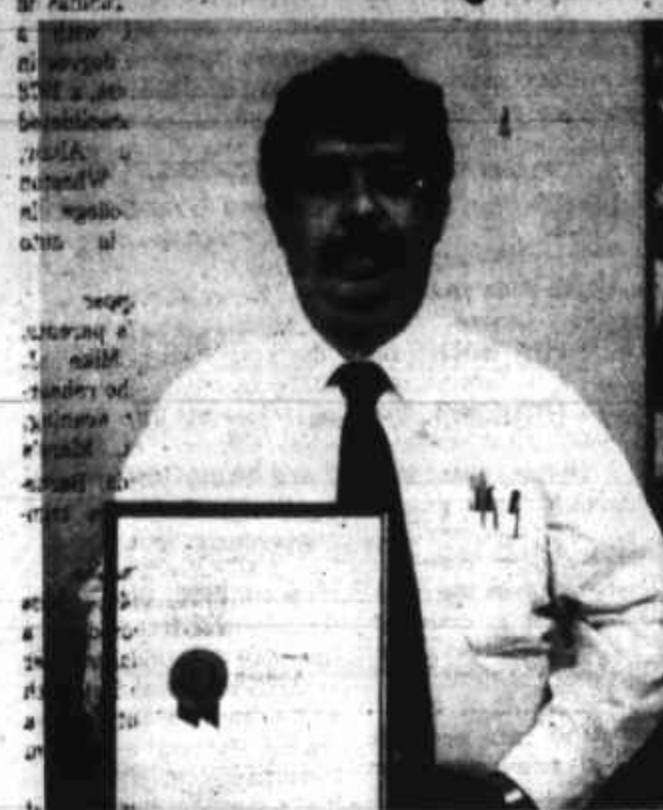


Philip Soto, Jr. Completes Life Underwriters Training Course

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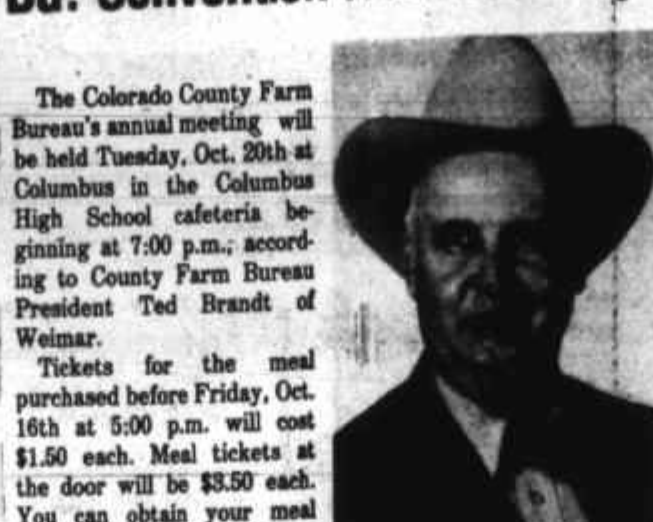
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Humorist To Speak At Farm Bu. Convention Next Tuesday
