Hruzek Well SW Of Garwood Is Good Dual Completion

A dual zone gas producer southwest of Garwood and a new location north of Sheridan highlight oil and gas activity in the area this week.

The dual gas producer is the No. 1-C A. J. Hruzek in the County's Lydia Field by Houston independent operator Louis A. Newitt.

The well was producing from perforations at the 3,665 to 3,675 foot level with potential of 345,000 cubic feet of gas per day on an 8/64th inch choke; and also from 3,658 to 3,662 feet with 450,000 cubic feet of gas per day at this level on a 11/64th choke.

Combined absolute open flow is 1,475,000 cubic feet per day with two-thirds of the potential originating from the shallower production level. The well is located in a 140-acre lease in the S&M RR Co. Survey.

County Asks Bids For Fire, Windstorm Ins.

Colorado County Commissioners' Court in session Monday authorized County Judge Lester J. Cranek to advertise for bids for fire insurance and windstorm insurance coverage on county owned properties. Bids are expected to be opened at the November 9th session.

In discussing valuations of the county-owned properties, the commissioners approved increases in courthouse value, it was also on contents in the courthouse building.

It was noted that improvements made under the courthouse restoration program (such as addition of carpeting and other new equipment) have increased

County Having Difficulty In Filling Vacant Election Spots

Judge Cranek emphasized however that elections will be held in the respective precincts in the absence of a presiding judge or alternate judge, those voting can elect an election judge.

The court, earlier this year, approved payment of the minimum wage for persons working in the general election; and the election judge in each precinct gets an additional \$10 for returning the voting box to the courthouse. The sheriff's department is obligated to see that the election boxes get to the respective election judges.

In other action the court voted to change the voting place in the Buescher precinct from former Kollman home to the Sunset Plaza building on Highway 71 north of Columbus, owned by Stan Theut.

The court also approved appointment of three members to the Colorado County Children's Services Board. Terms of Randall Amour and Wilma Hinton are expiring and they are not eligible for reappointment since serving a full three-year term. Martin Williams of Columbus was named to replace Amour and Mary Nelson of Weimar was named to succeed Wilma Hinton.

Term of Darrell Varley of Sheridan also is expiring but since she filled the unexpired term of Mary Reinhardt who moved from Sheridan, she is eligible to serve another term and she was reappointed.
