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Study Identifies Licensing Threats At So. Texas Plant

Houston Lighting and Power Company, acting as project manager, has forwarded a special study to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission that identifies a number of concerns in the area of design of the South Texas Project. The study completed by the Quadrex Corp. of Campbell, California, identified a number of areas that "pose a serious threat to plant licensability."

Bob Range, General Power and Light Company's executive vice president and South

Texas Project management committee representative, said that this report was indicative of the utilities' desire to develop a safe and workable plant. Of the 283 total findings by Quadrex HLP has reported that only two are reportable deficiencies under NRC regulations. HLP has also reported that most of the findings will probably not affect work that is already completed.

Fair and mild weather is forecast for the Coastal Plains the next couple of days. High pressure shifting eastward will bring a return of southerly breezes and slightly warmer, more humid air. However, a cold front entering the region Thursday will reinforce mild temperatures and sunny conditions through most of the weekend. No rainfall of any consequence is indicated. For the Rice Belt, soybean and second rice harvests should be favored by mild, sunny weather the next several days. Better drying rates should assist firming up of soybeans. However, a heavy dew the next couple of mornings will delay harvest start up times until around noon. Wheat and oat pastures will make good growth as sunny, mild weather continues. The early morning hours will be the best time to apply insecticides or fungicides due to stronger afternoon breezes.

Dist. Judge Rules In Favor Of Doctor In El Campo Hosp. Suit

Federal District Court Judge Carl O. Bue, Jr., Houston, has ruled in favor of Dr. Angela O'Connor in her suit against the El Campo Hospital Authority Board of Directors, former Memorial Hospital Administrator Steve Sanders and several members of the hospital's staff. Others named individually in the suit were Authority members Wilbur Swanson, Esther Carrio, John Hancock, Jr., Parker, Bryce Sanford, Tom Henderson, Harlan Nelson and Norris Ruan. El Campo Leader-News.

The Hospital Authority met in a called executive session Wednesday evening (Oct. 14) with its attorneys, Bill Bludworth of Houston and Richard Manke, to discuss the ramifications of the \$93,468 O'Connor was seeking in damages.

For the O'Connor suit, the court ruled that O'Connor's civil rights were violated when she was suspended from the ECMH staff on Sept. 10, 1979, for an alleged violation of obscenity privileges that were revoked on July 30, 1979. The hospital also charged her at that time with "disruption of hospital operations."

Melvin Parker, Jr., president of the Authority Board, said the judge awarded O'Connor a citation of Ireland, \$80,000 in punitive damages and \$13,468 in actual damages due to loss of operating revenue. He said \$40,000 of the punitive damages were levied against the Authority Board, while the balance was levied against the hospital.
