Business Burglaries At Weimar, Frelsburg

Colorado County Sheriff's Department is investigating burglaries at businesses in Weimar and Frelsburg.

At 8:10 a.m. Wednesday, Nov. 11th, Ralph Davilla of Weimar reported to the sheriff's department that his place of business east of Weimar had been broken into. Entry was gained by crawling through a vent fan. Missing were two AM-FM radio cassette recorders, seven pocket knives, one AM-FM cassette player, loose change, four cases of beer, several Bic lighters and a necklace and earring set and a 25 automatic pistol.

Prints were obtained at the scene and will be processed at the DPS lab in Austin according to investigating officers. The estimated value of the theft was placed at \$2,000.

Leslie Heinsohn of Frelsburg reported to sheriff's officers at 8:00 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 12th a theft at the Heinsohn's Store in Frelsburg. There was no sign of a forced entry to the store and officers believe that someone may have hidden in the store prior to closing time and exited with the stolen merchandise after the store closed.

Reported as missing were three pistols, two rifles and a shotgun. Also taken were several cartons of cigarettes, several boxes of ammunition, and approximately \$200 in cash.

Investigating officers found prints at the scene and they will be processed at the DPS lab in Austin. The investigation continues.

Two men were arrested for the burglary of a mobile home east of Weimar last week and the sheriff's department says that the arrests have cleared up over thirty burglaries in other areas of the state and in Louisiana.

On Wednesday, Nov. 4th a citizen reported the burglary of the Cernoch mobile home near Weimar.

During the past week, a number of officers from various locations came to Columbus to interview the two subjects. Officers from the sheriff's office in Lake Charles, Louisiana made the trip to Columbus and interviewed the two; and the local sheriff's office was advised that 36 burglaries in Louisiana had been solved by the arrest made in this county.

The sheriff's office was also able to locate the owner of the two remaining guns and jewelry recovered at the time of the arrest. These items were taken in a burglary in Harris County.

The investigation continues on burglaries which may have occurred in the San Antonio area. Billy Joe Woodward and Leonard Vincent are still in the Colorado County jail on the indictment returned by the Grand Jury on November 9th. Colorado County will maintain control of the two until they have been to court here, then they will be released to whatever department may want them, said Sheriff Jim Broussard.
