Family Planning Course To Start in El Campo Thurs.

Natural Family Planning will be the subject of a series of four monthly classes taught by the Couple to Couple League at St. Philip's Parish Hall, El Campo, Texas, beginning this Thursday, January 14, 1982. The other classes are on Thurs., Feb. 11, Thurs., March 11 and Thurs., April 8. Classes will start at 7:00 p.m. The course fee is \$15, and materials are \$13. Engaged couples and married couples from the Nade-Garwood area, and Rock Island-Sheridan area may attend on a free scholarship provided by a donor and the Christian Mothers Society of Nade. To obtain a scholarship, couples should contact Mrs. Betty (A. C.) Leopold (758-3285), or Mrs. Mary Ann (Walter) Gold (758-3554), or Mrs. Linda Gallagher (758-3583) of Nade, and Mrs. Janie (Arthur) Yanez (in person) of Garwood. In the last course of classes, couples who completed the course were from Eagle Lake, Rosenberg, Nade, Garwood, Rock Island, El Campo and Hillje. Another large class is anticipated to begin on Thurs., Jan. 14.
