Estimates are that farm prices should average about \$6 per bushel, down considerably from the livestock producers will be same facility: 1980/81 average of \$7.61. In late 1981, prices were running as low as \$5.25 per bushel with very little indication of price improvement in early 1982. With lower prices and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's cost of production for soybeans averaging about \$4.88 per bushel, should encourage farmers to reduce acreage 1982. An interesting note is that a record 15 percent of the 1981 soybean acreage was double cropped and indications are that there will be more double cropping

It is estimated that the domestic crush of soybeans will be up from last season. Even though the total market value of oil and meal will be down, the low cost of raw beans will result in crushing margins returning to normal levels. Processors will have problems moving soybean oil because the pipelines already are full. Even with prices near 20 cents per pound, this large quantity of oil will be hard to move into the domestic and export markets.


