(Continued from page 1.) are anticipated to include a four-lane highway with a left turn lane in the middle. Curb and guttering is not expected to be included in the plans, which will be totally funded by the state.

Several residents along the proposed improvement area met with the city council several weeks ago and voiced their disfavor with any improvement to the road, mainly for home safety reasons and because curb and guttering would be required at the residents' cost. It was anticipated at that time if the project did not work out, then the funds would be used to improve Postoffice Street (PM 102 north) from McCarty Street to the city limits.

However, the State Highway Department has indicated that there was not enough traffic there to justify the project and has decided that the Highway 90A improvement project was a top priority for traffic safety reasons.

Mayor Struss also indicated that the project is entirely under the State's authority and that the city will have no say so in the matter.

Highway Department officials are expected to contact property owners along the route to give more details of the project and to announce a date for a public meeting.
