Older Texans Save Energy For Health

Stopping Energy Thieves

(Final part of 3-part series)

After you have detected the air leaks in your home, take some "winterizing" steps to stop energy thieves. Here are some easy, economical steps to take - in making your home an "energy saver."

1. Caulking and weatherstripping are the most energy saving improvements. You can save up to one-fourth of heating costs by plugging cracks, gaps in walls and spaces around doors, windows and pipes.

Caulking comes in tubes or cartridges for a "caulking gun" and sells for about \$3. Weatherstripping comes in several forms - foam rubber with adhesive backing, tube-like strips of vinyl and spring metal.

2. Use sunshine for warmth by opening blinds or drapes during the day on the "sunny side" of the house. Keep other blinds and drapes drawn to maintain heat inside. Always close drapes and blinds at night.

3. Since direct sunlight may cause glare for some older adults, apply transparent plastic on the outside of window panes - to act as a storm window and glare reducer.

4. Finding Financial Assistance

Seeking financial help to obtain weatherization assistance and partial subsidies for fuel bills in crisis situations is another alternative for combating rising energy costs.

If you are 60 years or older, a good place to begin is at your local Information and Referral Service or your Area Agency on Aging. These agencies know what

assistance programs are offered in your county. If you are low income, elderly and/or handicapped, call your Community Action Agency's Energy Assistance Program or the local Department of Human Resources.

Other agencies to ask for energy help are the city or county Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs.

How The New Tax Law Affects You

Last summer, the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 was signed into law. Its provisions began affecting taxpayers as early as July 20, 1981, and continue for several years thereafter.

The new tax law does more than simply lower personal income taxes; it provides tax benefits for savings, for charitable contributions, and to those planning for retirement. It also gives some tax relief for two-earner couples, older Americans selling their homes, and taxpayers who pay for the care of a child while they work.

To help you understand the major provisions of the Tax Act, here is a summary of the changes affecting the individual taxpayer:

Individual Tax Rates and Indexing
Tax withholding rates for individuals were reduced by 5 percent on October 1, 1981 and will be cut another 10 percent on October 1, 1982.

Raider Boys End Regular Season Play Thurs., Tues.

Post-Season District Play-Off Game To Be Played Feb. 26 or 27th

The Rice Raider boys added two more wins to their season total during the past week of varsity basketball action, struggling by Belleville last Friday night and ending last Friday night in a not so inspiring fashion, on Tuesday night of this week.

Rice, which appears to be still licking wounds from the second round loss to Columbus on Tuesday night of last week, will wind up its regular season - play during the coming week - playing in Waller on Thursday (that is correct) and in Hempstead on Tuesday of next week.

Raider coach Jack Grammer is hoping that his team will use the final two games to regain its composure and to build some momentum going into the post-season playoff game. Rice, the winner of the first round is assured of a playoff spot, and appears to be heading for a rematch against Columbus since they currently are leading in second round action.

Rice, now 25-5 on the year, narrowly avoided a loss in Belleville last Friday coming from behind to win in the last minutes 56-52. Rodney Hackman provided most of the punch for Belleville scoring 23 of 28 points in the first half and ending the game with a total of 33.

Belleville led at half 28-25 and after three quarters 42-40. Coach Grammer emptied his bench trying to find a combination that would spark the Raider offense. Finally in the fourth quarter Rice was able to get the breaks it needed as it outscored the Brahmas 16-10 to take the win.

John Dawson led the Raider scoring with 19 points, Rodney Parker added 14 and Rob Johnson had 11.

Freehams Loss
In freshman action against Belleville last Friday at Rice, the Raiders lost 27-18. Michael Thomas led the Raiders in scoring with 12.

Raiders Beat Brazos
The Raiders had no trouble racking up their 25th win of the season Tuesday night as they breezed by Brazos 70-46 in the final home game of the season. But the manner in which they did it was not one in which Coach Grammer was very pleased with.

"It wasn't a very well played game," admitted Grammer, who even suggested that it might have been as poorly played as the Raiders narrow win performance last Friday in Belleville. "We just have not played well these past two games, I don't really feel that we're still feeling the effects of our loss to Columbus... it's just a lack of concentration and too many little mistakes."

Highlighting the dismal winning performance described by the Raider coach, Kenneth Bluntson who scored 24 points and pulled down 20 rebounds, Ronald Dawson added to the Raider scoring punch coming off the bench to score 18 points. John Dawson added 12 points and Rodney Parker contributed 10 to round out the scoring leaders for Rice. Rob Johnson collected six assists in the contest to lead Rice in that department.

Rice High School football coach Clifton Darden says Bluntson has the potential of being a standout at Houston. "Kenneth has good size and I'm sure he will fill out even more at Houston," said Darden. "He has a lot of natural potential, good speed and can be very physical. He can be as good as he wants to be."

Besides his success on the gridiron, Bluntson is also an outstanding basketball player and was a member of last year's Class AAA State championship team. He is the only returning starter from that team and has helped guide the Raiders to a 25-5 record so far this season and the first half District 22AAA title.

Basketball has been the big sport in Kenneth's family prior to his football success. "He's been playing basketball since he was a little kid," said Darden. "He's a natural and has helped guide the Raiders to a 25-5 record so far this season and the first half District 22AAA title."

Kenneth Bluntson, 6' 7", 235 pound senior at Rice High School, has received a football scholarship to play at the University of Houston.

The football and basketball standout signed with the Cougars at his home in Voss Populi on Wednesday evening of last week with assistant football coach Jim Elam of the University of Houston, representing head Cougar coach Bill Yeoman at the signing session.

Bluntson, who helped anchor both the defensive and offensive lines for the Raider football team this past season, was named to the All-District 22AAA defensive team following a successful year in which the Raiders were 8-2.

Coach Yeoman was very pleased with signing Bluntson. "I'm really excited about signing Kenneth," admitted Yeoman in Houston last Thursday morning. "It will be a joy to work with the young man and I wish we had more like him."

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ELMS Boys Lose
Both the ELMS boys' teams were eliminated in the first round of competition in the district tournament for the boys at Brazos last weekend. The competition was the district action for both teams this season.

Both Raider teams, coached by Vivian Rollins, were tied to the tournament with perfect records in league play. Overall the seventh graders finished the season with a 12-4 record while the eighth grade girls finished with an impressive 18-1 mark.

The seventh grade Raiders opened play beating Waller 39-12 on Thursday afternoon and then knocked off Hempstead on Friday to qualify for the finals. In the championship game on Saturday, the Raiders faced Belleville and won that low-scoring game 14-13. Top scorers for the Raiders in the championship game were Marsha McTeer, six; Terri Clayton, four; and Carrie Perry, three.

Eighth Grade Results
In the eighth grade division, the Raider girls protected their unbeaten record in the first round of play by beating Belleville. But in the semi-finals the Raiders suffered their first and only loss of the season to Waller, 34-28, and were eliminated from the tournament. In the finals, Hempstead won the championship by beating Waller.

The tournament marks the end of the season for both Raider teams.

Clifton Tyler Angry About Brutal Slaying Of Dog
A Columbus man reported his hunting dog was killed by a 22 caliber rifle Tuesday, Feb. 2 for no apparent reason.

The dog owner, Clifton Tyler of 101 South River Dr., said he first noticed his 4-year-old white Labrador retriever missing when the dog failed to return home Jan. 28.

The next morning I searched down by the river and I found him dead under the water in the river at the end of Jones Street, about four blocks below my house, shot through the head one time with a 22 caliber rifle. There was a pool of blood on the bank right there and the collar was removed... obviously to destroy any identification," said Tyler. Tyler said the animal was worth \$1,000.

"I think someone was irritated by the dog but it was senseless to shoot him. I'm not without my dog, especially when he's so valuable, like this dog did. I could understand it more if it was just a stray," said Tyler. Tyler said he wanted an account of the dog killing in the newspaper to prevent it happening again.

"If there's something in the paper about it, maybe somebody else's dog won't get shot. Dogs are supposed to be on a leash and they are supposed to be in a yard but my dog went on anybody's property when he was shot," he said. Columbus County Citizen.
