Monsignor Was Killed In Auto-Pedestrian Accident In N. Mex.

Final Rites Held

At St. Mary's Church Saturday

It was a beautiful day, Saturday, Feb. 27, but a cloud of sorrow hung over the small community of Nade, Texas, when the Right Reverend Monsignor Aloysius Leopold was laid to rest in the St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery in the Clergy Plot beside six other priests. Msgr. Leopold, 78, died in a pedestrian-vehicle traffic accident in Santa Fe, New Mexico, on Tuesday night, Feb. 23rd.

The Monsignor retired from full-time pastoral work in 1973 due to ill health and he had been residing in the St. Mary's rectory at St. Mary's Church in Nade since that time.

The body of Mr. Leopold arrived early Saturday morning at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Nade. It laid in state until 11:00 o'clock when a High Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated in his honor.
