Bell Telephone Rep. Speaks To Study Club Members

The Eagle Lake Study Club met Wednesday, March 10 at 2 p.m. at the Eagle Lake Community Center. David Wintermann introduced Mr. Sage, a representative of the Bell Telephone Company, who gave a talk on things old and new.

He reported that Bell Telephone Company was 106 years old March 10, and there have been more changes and improvements in the last 10 years than at any other time.

Sage noted that the vacuum tube was invented in 1924 and it gave amplification to sound. An instrument had to be built large enough to hold the tube which was quite large. Then came transistors which won the Nobel Prize and were much smaller and could be used in a much smaller instrument.

Now they have the Silicon Chip which is one-fourth inch square and does a much better job than anything heretofore, he continued. Also optical fibers have come into use in transmitting sound. They are so small many can be put into a tube about the size of a pencil. They have taken the place of copper wire which has become in very short supply.

Something of interest to people who receive obscene telephone calls: Technicians are working on an instrument which can be connected to the phone and when activated tell where the call is coming from. It has not been perfected yet for general use.
