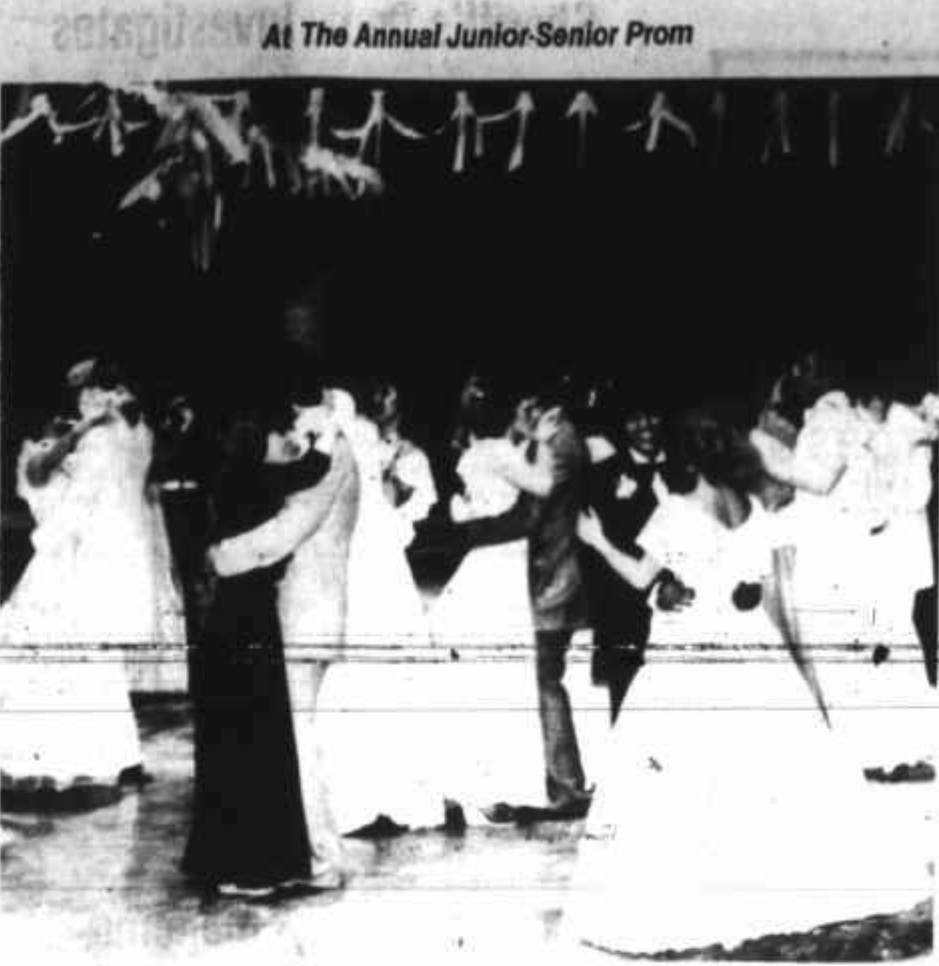
Meet The Rice Raider Track Team
