Sheriff's Dept. Investigates Four Home Burglaries

Colorado County Sheriff's Department investigated three home burglaries and the entry of a fourth home where nothing was taken during the past week.

At 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, March 16th, Mrs. Jimmy Baranowski of New Ulm reported that her brother's travel trailer parked east of Freisburg had been broken into. Investigation showed entry was gained by breaking a window on the north side of the trailer. Missing were a single mantle Coleman lantern and a fishing rod and reel.

The owner of the trailer, Ron Burroughs, was out of town at the time of the break-in. George King, who resides east of Columbus, reported to the department at 4 p.m. Tuesday, March 16th a theft at his residence. No forced entry was noted and the theft was reported to have occurred between 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon while everyone was away from the residence.

Taken from the residence were thirteen rifles and shotguns valued at approximately \$3,859.00. Nothing else in the house was disturbed.

Thursday, March 18th at 5:00 a.m. Joe Ward of Weishuhn Road near New Ulm reported a burglary of the L. A. Dittlinger weekend home. Dittlinger resides in Houston. Entry was gained by breaking out a front door window. Taken were: a microwave oven, a 410 shotgun, a blender, clock radio and portable eight-track AM-FM radio.

Charlie Lleverino of Weimar reported to the sheriff's office at 10 p.m. Monday, March 22nd that he and his family had come home about 6:30 p.m. and had been watching television until about 9:30 p.m. when his son Johnny decided to go to bed. recommended by Mayor Struss to allow the department to hire a fifth officer. Both Councilmen Baker and Van Nort favored the proposal but firmly indicated that the additional officer would mean several improvements in the patroling of the city before getting their approval. Namely, these included patroling school campuses regularly both before and after school; more patroling in the downtown area on foot; and better enforcement of parking meters and the "No U-Turn" ordinance in the downtown area. The other councilmen and the mayor also favored those "conditions."

A public hearing on the proposed budget will be held during the regular session of the council at its next meeting on Tues., April 13th to allow citizens to make any suggestions on the proposed budget. Haring any major changes in the proposal, the council is expected to give its approval to the budget at that time.
