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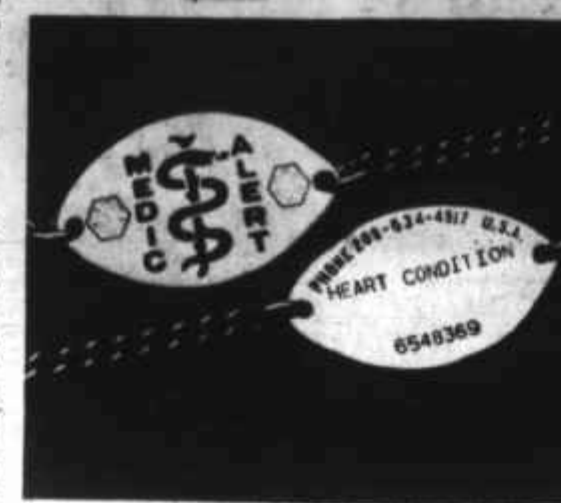
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Emblem That Saves Lives

In an emergency your life could be saved by a Medie Alert emblem designed to alert rescuers to the wearer's special medical problem which may range from diabetes, heart condition, hypertension to epilepsy for example.
For the active sports enthusiast, jogger and swimmer who typically dresses light and carries no wallet, the Medie Alert emblem provides a quick means of supplying identification and information in an emergency.
Noted actor Lorne Greene serves as National Chairman for Medie Alert, the non-profit organization devoted to providing quick and accurate emergency medical identification. Greene, an active tennis player and physical fitness advocate, has his blood type and "no known medical problems" engraved on the emblem.
The member's special medical condition is engraved on the emblem, along with an identification number, plus a color twenty-four hour day phone number to Medie Alert's emergency medical information center. The center provides detailed life-saving information within seconds from data stored in the member's file.
Currently, some 1.2 million Americans belong to Medie Alert, a non-profit organization which has been operating for the past twenty-six years. The organization estimates that one out of every five Americans has some condition that should be known in an emergency.
