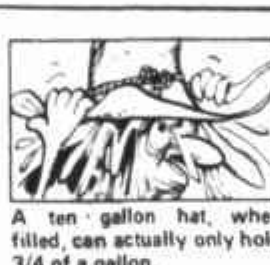
Who's Zat? Rice Students Attend Journalism Meet Mar. 24
