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CPL Files Request For Rate Increase

Central Power and Light Company announced Friday that it is filing applications for a rate increase with the cities it serves and the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The company is requesting higher rates to cover a revenue deficiency of \$156 million. Several changes in the design of rates are also proposed for certain commercial customers and municipalities and some other customer classes.

Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer Bob Ranges explained that inflation, higher interest rates, and the need for capacity to serve the growing needs of South Texas are the main reasons the increase is needed. "It has been 30 months since our last increase," he said, "and since then inflation, interest rates and construction costs have climbed steadily."

Construction of new facilities is necessary because of the rapid growth in population and energy use in South Texas. The number of customers on the CPL system has risen by almost nine percent, since the last increase placed, and the peak demand required on the CPL generating system is up 14.4 percent. The demand for electricity is expected to grow substantially during the next several years. This growth makes it essential that the company build the South Texas Project nuclear generating station. CPL needs to put the construction work in progress in its rate base and start earning a current cash return on its investment, according to Ranges.

Another major factor in the increase as taxes which the company must pay. Ranges said that the company's total

tax expense last year was \$93.7 million, an increase of 32 percent over 1979. "At most 45 percent of this rate increase will be paid out by the company in the form of taxes at the local, state and federal level," he said.

The requested increase would provide a 13.3 percent rate of return on money invested by CPL to serve its customers. This would keep the company in an adequate financial position to raise necessary capital and finance its operations.
