Rice FFA To Host Area III Meet May 7

The Rice High School Future Farmers of America Chapter will host the Area III FFA Convention on Friday, May 7, 1982 beginning at 1:15 p.m. at the Rice High School in Altair.

Area III includes a 20-county area in the Houston Gulf Coast area including most of South Central Texas with some 10,000 FFA members. 1/6 of the total FFA membership in the state of Texas. Area III is the largest of the 10 areas in the state.

Ocean Gets Wider

The floor of the Atlantic Ocean gets about 1 1/4 inches wider a year, according to the National Geographic Society. The Pacific Ocean floor, however, is shrinking.

Oil, Gas Drilling In Area

Two completions and one abandonment highlight oil and gas activity in the area this week.

Realities Energy Corp. of Houston reports completion of the No. 10, R. Strunk as a new gas producer in Wharton County's South Lissie Field. The well is producing 580,000 cubic feet of gas per day on a 3/4-inch choke and had absolute open flow of 450,000 cubic feet per day. The well is in the L. P. Jennings Survey in Wharton County.

The other completion is Holt Oil & Gas of Dallas No. 1 Kleiman Unit which is flowing 409,000 cubic feet of gas per day on a 1.25-inch choke and has absolute open flow potential of 510,000 CFPD. Production is from 11,650 to 11,676 feet and the well is located in a 691 acre

New locations include the No. 1 Robert R. Wells, Jr. et al by The Anschutz Corp. of Houston 1.5 miles southwest of East Bernard in Wharton County's GH&CR Survey; and the No. 1 Mahabite by Texas Petroleum Inc. of Houston a 6,000 foot test six miles northwest of El Campo in Wharton County's William Vess Survey.
