Over My Shoulder

March's cattle market started building steam and moving upward. The countryside began greening up, revealing spring is around the corner. This new growth, however, has not had enough time to get much height. Winter grazing still kept trying to do some good, after suffering from the past cold temperatures. This year some folks report their oats and rye grass didn't give much grazing.

The first signs of tapering off feeding hay was seen. Cowfolks found they had some hay left over.

Condition of cattle hasn't changed much from last month. Many calves still look rough with some calves looking like little "rain balls."

Feeding of calves has remained the exception rather than the rule.

In March, slaughter cow prices through Central, South and East Texas reached their highest price marks all year. Big cows were \$44 to \$49, a few knocking on the \$50 door, generally lighter weight cows \$34 to \$44.

Stock-feder prices started the month in a strong tone and held onto it, with the overall quality of calves on the low side. Orders being used in March were for calves suitable to be turned out for grazing. Calves needed to fill these orders were thin, age, a good frame and healthy.

Good steer calves were \$71 to \$81; 400 to 500 pounds \$63 to \$73; 500 to 600 weights \$61 to \$66. Heifer calves were \$58 to \$63; 400 to 500 pounds \$57 to \$61, with replacement heifers \$65 to \$70.

Fed slaughter cattle looked their best all year. Fed cattle in Texas Panhandle reached \$67.50, their highest price mark so far in '82, no backing of fed cattle in the nation's feedlots was seen, the dressed beef trade was in counted.

The USDA 14-state hog and pig report showed total hogs down 10 percent, market hogs down 10 percent and the number of breeding hogs off 14 percent, compared to last year's figures.

For this spring, fewer market hogs gives fed cattle a better avenue of approach to higher prices.

March gave off a few rays of new hope and optimism. Light volume through South, Central, and East Texas markets helped prop up a firmer cattle market. Better attitudes started growing on people which can be a positive factor for April.

Whooper Sightings Should Be Reported

The endangered whooping crane wintering at the Arkansas National Wildlife Refuge and adjacent marshlands are departing for their spring migration, and wildlife officials request observers report any sightings of the birds along the way.

In Texas, persons seeing any of the large white cranes may call the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's toll-free information line, 1-800-792-1112.

Officials said the cranes normally start their northward flight around March 25, and their route through Texas can include a wide swath of counties in the central part of the state. Their breeding grounds are on the Wood Buffalo National Park in Alberta, Canada, about 2,500 miles from here.

Officials said sighting reports should include as much information as possible, including the birds' location, behavior, direction of travel and types of leg bands observed.
