Only 27% of the qualified voters in Colorado County went to the polls in Democratic and Republican primary elections last Saturday and named nominees for the General Election coming up in November or set up run-offs for six state positions on the Democratic side of the ledger.

Drawing the greatest interest in this county was the two-man race for the office of Sheriff to serve the remainder (through Dec. 31, 1984) of the term of the late George (Doc) Mueller.

Sheriff Jim Broussard who was appointed to the office until the next general election by the Colorado County Commissioners' Court, walked away in the voting drawing 76% of the votes, or 1805 in the Democratic Primary while his opponent, Houston police officer Tom Adams of Frelsburg, received only 564 votes.

Sheriff Broussard carried seventeen of the eighteen voting boxes, plus the absentee voting, with Adams leading only in his home voting precinct in Frelsburg where he received 101 votes and Broussard 67.

According to County Tax Officer Henry J. Hajovsky, Colorado County had 8785 qualified voters and around 2369 voted in the Democratic Primary and another 162 in the Republican primary election.

Colorado County voters also went along with those over the state in giving Mark White a lead in the six-way battle for the nomination for the Governor's office. In this county's Democratic primary, Attorney General White drew 1201 votes, followed by Buddy Temple with 563, Bob Armstrong 246, David Young 87, Don Beagle 19 and Ray Mayo 18.

Republicans Will Not Have A Runoff

Republicans voted in four polling places in this county. Eagle Lake, Columbus, Altair and Garwood and gave Walter H. Mengden, Jr. a slight edge for the nomination as United States Senator. He received 69 votes, Jim Collins 65 and Don L. Richardson 9. For U. S. Representative in the 14th District Tom Newton received 33 and Joe Wyatt, Jr. 99.

For governor, the voters in this county gave incumbent Governor Bill Clements 136 and only 8 to his opponent Duke Embs; for Comptroller of Public Accounts, Raymond Frank received 48 and Mike Richards 74; for Land Office Commissioner, Al Gutierrez drew 13, Andrew Jackson 48 and Woody Glascock 87.

Only other contests were: for Associate Justice Court of Appeals, Place 1, Witcher
