A total of 679 persons cast ballots in the election.

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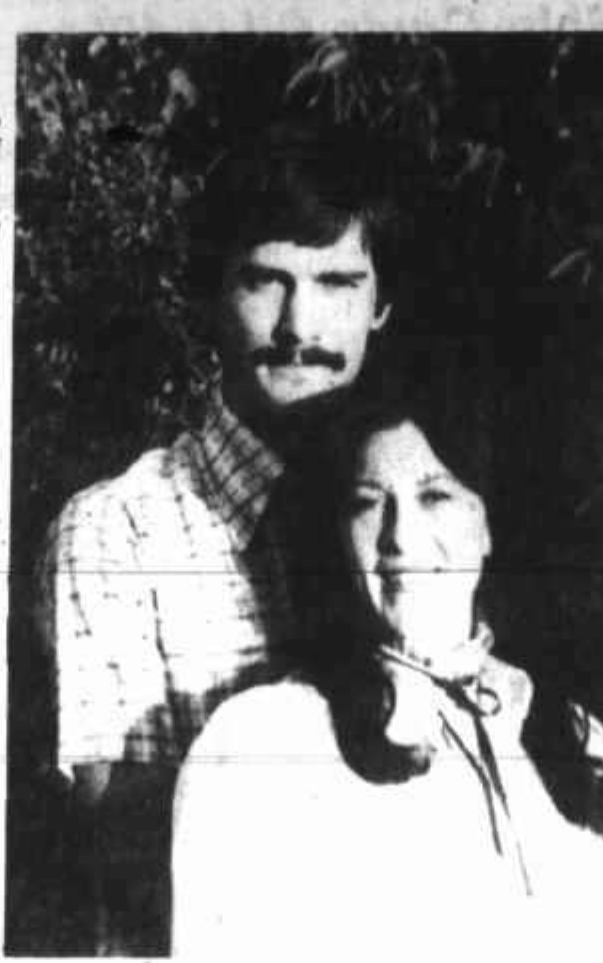
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Beverly Ann Garrett, Wesley Zboril To Wed In Marlin June 6
