Ag demonstrations
Aquatic weeds are a major problem in ponds of Colorado County. Ponds owned by Matthew Hagendorf, Fritz Crane, and Allan Hill were treated in May with aquatic weed control herbicides. Periodically ponds have to be restocked as the fishing becomes so poor and a population of rough fish overtake a pond. Ponds owned by Matthew Hagendorf and Allan Hill were treated in May with 5 percent rotenone powder at the rate of 10 pounds per acre foot of water. This is a safe fish toxicant and is very effective on removal of scale fish. It does not, however, give complete control of mud catfish. The Hagendorf pond will be restocked at a later date with Marian Bass as part of a bass fish feeding trial. Hill's pond will be stocked with channel catfish and fed a commercial catfish food. Feed for both ponds will be automatically dispensed with a mechanical feeder.

These demonstrations are part of an ongoing educational program suggested by the Colorado County Livestock Committee and implemented by the County Extension Agent.

Fire ant bait delayed

Due to production problems the joint state and county distribution effort of Andro fire ant bait has been delayed to early fall. Texas Department of Agriculture officials are targeting for a September distribution of the ant bait. The manufacturer has agreed to reduce the ant bait cost to the state which will enable the state to purchase a larger than anticipated amount. The cost to the landowner will remain \$1.00 per pound.

Distribution dates will be properly advertised in the news media.

Tax incentives for soil, water conservation
Farmers investing in soil and water conservation now get additional tax incentives. Producers receiving payments made for approved conservation practices can now exclude these, under certain conditions, from their gross income for federal tax purposes.

Proper grass management essential

(By Soil Conservation Service)
Proper management on range grass plants is essential if these plants are to remain healthy, vigorous and thrifty. Understanding how these grasses grow is also essential in order to properly manage these plants, according to the Soil Conservation Service.

The best way to achieve proper grazing of grass on rangelands is to stock the livestock numbers according to the available forage produced. Periodic periods of rest from grazing are needed to allow new plants to start and develop. This will help to maintain a healthy, vigorous plant community.

Deferred grazing is another valuable way to improve all rangelands. It gives the land a rest for a certain period of time such as three months each year during the growing season. This will promote natural revegetation by increasing the vigor of the grass stand and permit desirable plants to produce seed. It can provide a food reserve for fall and winter grazing or emergency use. It will improve the appearance of the range, and help prevent soil and water loss.
