Governor Clements has done just this. Since 1978, when Governor Clements was elected, he has been a staunch supporter of education. Texas teachers received only an average salary of \$13,042, or 86.52 percent of the average national teacher's salary.

When school starts in September the average Texas teacher will make \$19,019, or 97.13 percent of the national average. This

adds up to a 45.5 percent teacher pay increase.

In 1979, Governor Clements appointed Dr. Willis Tate, from Southern Methodist University, to chair a new Governor's Advisory Committee on Education. This committee was comprised of twenty citizens who helped the Governor put together his education package.

The six components of his education package were:

1. Return of Texas schools to basics (reading, writing, arithmetic).

2. Law to enforce and provide for discipline in classrooms.

3. A summer school pilot program to aid and encourage slower students.

4. Competency testing for incoming teachers.

5. Establishment of an independent committee to make recommendations toward a vocational educational program.

6. Provision of an even higher pay scale to encourage teacher excellence.

Of these six components the first five passed the Texas Legislature.

As you can see, Governor Clements is, and will continue to be, committed to quality education, through the individual teacher.
