The officer attempted to stop the subject, Willie Bob Thomas of Eagle Lake, by using the siren and red lights, but the subject proceeded at a high rate of speed. In pursuit, officer Frankum observed the subject running stop signs at Lake and State streets and again at Lake and Prairie streets. Subject then turned right onto Union street, stopped the vehicle and ran into a house at 408 East Union street.

Subject was asked to come out from the house and did so. He was arrested and served his rights, and then transported to the police department.

Bond was set by Judge M. M. Jones at \$500 for criminal mischief and at \$250 for evading arrest. He was also issued two citations for running stop signs.

Mrs. LeBlanc was driving eastbound on F.M. 3013, about 4.2 miles west of Eagle Lake, when the 1980 Chevy pickup she was driving ran off the road to the right, then came back across the left lane before overturning several times.

Eagle Lake for most of her life.
