Raider statistics

The Raiders-Ricebirds football game last week was the fifth that El Campo has won against the Raiders, with Rice held winless. In fact, of the five contests, the larger 4A school has held 3A Rice to only 15 points.

The four previous contests were from 1970 through 1973, with scores of 22-7, 18-0, 35-0, and 43-8. Bob Johnson continued his winning ways with 82 yards rushing on 11 attempts, with 44 yards the longest gain. Johnson has averaged 627 yards per season the past two years and is the school's leading runner.

Dwayne Pagel rushed for 29 yards on 6 carries; Michael Davis ran for 25 yards on 8 carries to be part of the team's 135 yards gained on the ground with 30 carries.

Quarterback Troy Corman threw 10 passes, with four complete for 34 yards, and three interceptions. Phillip Schorlemmer caught three of the four for 38 yards, the longest with 17 yards. Johnson made the other reception but lost a yard on the play.

For punt returns, early in the game Mel Pratt ran a return back to the El Campo one yard line, but had the ball called back because of a "blocking below the waist" call.

For defense, Dwayne Pagel and Charlie Amos led with tackles and assists, with a total of 12 and 11 respectively, while Amos was credited with one blocked extra point, and Alex Ramirez recovered a fumble. Complete defense statistics are:

Steven B. Epps of Eagle received an undergraduate degree, agricultural economics at Texas A&M University's summer commencement exercises.

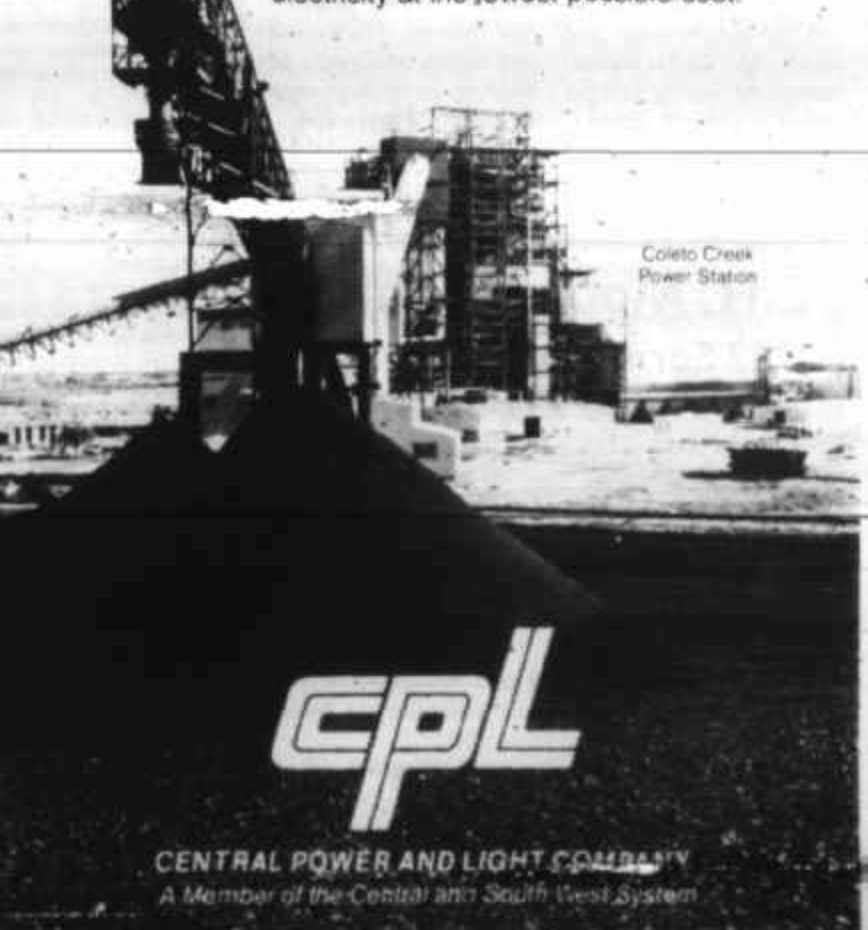
He is the son of Retired Colonel and Mrs. Lewis B. Epps of Eagle Lake.

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
