Raiders now 0-3 in district

The Rice Raiders lost again last Friday when they met Sealy at Rice Stadium in Altair. The final score was 44-18, Sealy.

The Rice offense only ran 36 plays, including 10 pass attempts. Of the 26 plays on rushing, Rob Johnson carried nearly half of them, moving toward a career rushing total that could be the record for the school. The loss Friday gives Sealy a one-game advantage in the five-game series between the schools that started in 1978. Rice beat them last year and in 1980.

Rice took the opening kick-off and started out on their own 19 yard line. They managed a first down on a quarterback sneak by quarterback Troy Corman but were forced to punt when the next three downs failed to produce any yardage.

On Sealy's first possession, they handily moved the ball from their own 38. It took them only seven plays to make the score 6-0 Sealy with just a little over six minutes gone in the first quarter.

On the kick, Rice pulled a reverse, and ran the ball down to the Sealy 40. Still they could move the ball no farther and gave the ball to Sealy on downs when a fourth and four pass play from Corman to Phillip Schorlemmer went incomplete.

The next Sealy series looked promising for the Raider defense, allowing Sealy only four yards in six plays that included a holding penalty by Sealy.

When Sealy punted from their own 38, Rob Johnson rushed in to block it, and the ball was picked up by Charlie Amos and taken in for a score. The extra point kick was no good and the

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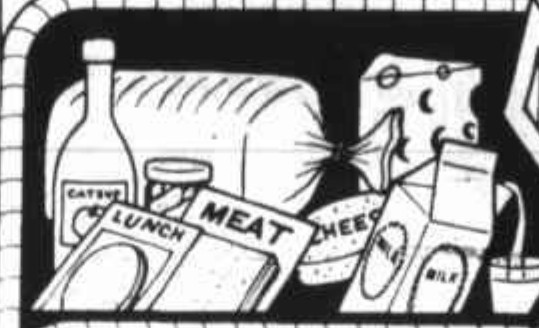

7th wins, 8th loses for Eagle Lake Raiders

The Eagle Lake Raiders 7th graders captured a 6-0 win last Thursday but the 8th graders lost 54-14 as the teams hosted Sealy on the middle school field here.

It wasn't until near the end of the game that the 7th grade Raiders scored. Jeff Marquart intercepted a Sealy pass and ran it back to the five yard line. Curt McTear came up with the score when he took the ball in to the end zone.

For the 8th graders, Sealy scored first, but then the Raiders' Billy King returned the favor. However, with the Raider two-point conversion, they took the lead 8-6.

Sealy proved too powerful though, scoring twice more in the first quarter and twice again in the second to make the score 34-8 at the half.

Just before the end of the second quarter, after their last score of the first half, Sealy was successful with an onside kick, but did not convert into points.

To open the second half, the 8th grade Raiders took the opening kickoff back 74 yards for their final score of the game. Dwight Stovall made that long run.

Sealy scored throughout the 3rd and 4th quarters. For the 7th graders, offensive standouts included James Williams with 34 rushing yards, and Brian Balas with 17. Curt McTear had 14 yards. On defense, Ben Gonzales caught one interception; Mark Kucherka had four tackles and one fumble recovery; McTear had three tackles and two fumble recoveries; Jeff Marquart had two tackles and an interception; and Douglas Tillman had four tackles, one fumble recovery and one interception.

Raider 8th graders helping out included Billy King with 125 yards rushing; Dwight Stovall with 77 yards; and Warren Hurd with 24 yards. On defense, Earnest Lemmons had six tackles and three assists; Mickey Scott had five tackles and five assists; Louis Bencomo had three tackles and two assists, and Jimmy Frost had three tackles and one interception.

The teams play Waller here this Thursday.
