Annette Strake campaigns for husband

Mrs. Annette Strake, wife of the Republican candidate for Texas Lt. Governor, spoke Monday afternoon at the home of Dr. and Mrs. Jose Ugarte, as part of a whistle stop campaign tour as the election draws near.

Speaking for her husband George Strake, who has held the Texas post of Secretary of State, she told a small gathering that her husband is campaigning on his background in business, and for the betterment of the state's school system. He holds a Master's Degree in Business from Harvard.

"Did you know that in 1980 more than half of all the ninth graders failed either a reading, writing or arithmetic test?" Mrs. Strake asked through a news release issued at the Ugarte home.

"In view of the fact that we spend 52 percent of our state budget for education, I think we need to ask if we are getting our money's worth," she said.

She went on to say that teachers and administrators were trying but they needed more help from both elected officials and parents.

Strake faces incumbent Bill Hobby in the November 2 election.

According to Maurice Angle, who accompanied Mrs. Strake as part of the staff traveling with her, he feels the Hobby-Strake race is very close, and that by election time Strake will pull ahead and win by a 51-49 percent margin.

His view of the Bill Clements-Mark White race for governor was that Clements will win by a 55-45 percent margin.

Angle made the comments when questioned by several Eagle Lake residents attending the coffee for Mrs. Strake.

John Wilson Redfish Hatchery unveiled

The world's largest redfish hatchery was dedicated Wednesday, October 20 with Governor Bill Clements releasing a mature, female redfish into a hatchery pond at Central Power and Light Company's Barney M. Davis Power Station in Flour Bluff.

That fish represents the beginning of a new era for saltwater fishing on the Texas coast and quite possibly the entire southern seaboard. Its release also marks the dedication of the John Wilson Redfish Hatchery, which will be operated by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). This facility was made possible with the unique aid of a 10,000 member sportsman's group called the Gulf Coast Conservation Association (GCCA) and a conservation-oriented electric utility, CPL. The GCCA acquired the 1.4 million dollars funding for the project from private foundations, non-profit organizations and from statewide contributions by GCCA members. CPL is providing 30 acres of land and access to thermally enriched water, and TPWD is providing manpower and has assumed all operating expenses (estimated to be in excess of \$100,000 annually).

The hatchery has been named in honor of the late Senator John Wilson of Texas, who died recently of inoperable lung cancer. Wilson actively campaigned for HB 1000, a bill which reclassified redfish and spotted sea trout in Texas as bonafide gamefish - off limits to Texas commercial fishing industry. Without the dedicated support and invaluable leadership put forth by Senator Wilson, the bill would not have come about. Without the bill, the hatchery would not have been able to replenish Texas bays with redfish for future generations.

Another early worker in the project was Corpus Christi, GCCA Chapter President Chuck Weil. Weil was project supervisor for GCCA and is emphatic about the role played by CPL.

TPWD Director of Fisheries Robert J. (Bob) Kemp says the department will begin to produce fingerling redfish by the Spring of 1983. The first crop, he said, will be distributed evenly up and down the Texas coast that summer.

Kemp has noted that due to a number of factors, substantial natural redfish spawns do not necessarily occur in Texas and other gulf states every year. However, that problem will be gone in Texas with the John Wilson Hatchery giving Mother Nature a helping hand.

In engineering terms, the hatchery is a huge complex of shallow nursery ponds fed by temperature-controlled water from the nearby CP&L cooling pond. That variable water temperature is vital to the survival of the tiny hatchlings, which are reared in the ponds until they reach the fingerling stage. Then they are tough little predators on their own, and are unceremoniously placed into Texas bays.

Hunters sought for area Big Buck contest

Area deer hunters may experience a bit more luck than usual this year as impressive prizes await those lucky enough to bag a winning whitetail during the first annual Shiner Business Men's Club Area Big Buck Contest.

The top prize for best buck will be a full shoulder mount from Tom's Taxidermy of Victoria, valued at \$240. Second prize will be a \$150 four-power Redfield scope from Shiner's Sports, etc., while a \$50 deluxe gun sling from Circle Y in Yoakum will be awarded to the third place finisher. A special "booby" prize for the freestack rack of horns will be free entry into next season's contest along with a hunting knife.

The deer must be a whitetail buck killed during the regular season, November 13, 1982 through January 2, 1983, in one of the following five counties: Lavaca, Gonzales, DeWitt, Fayette or Colorado. Deer killed in any other county are ineligible.
