UDC has program on Legendary Lady of Confederacy

"Sally Scull, Legendary Lady of the Confederacy" was the subject of the program given to the U.D.C. members by Mrs. Truman McMahon at the chapter's October meeting in the Nesbitt Memorial Library.

Sally was born Sarah Newman in Pennsylvania in 1820. The Newmans and relatives, the Williams Rabbs, moved into the La Grange area when Sally was about six years of age. She was issued a marriage license in Columbus on March 31st, 1838 to Jim Robinson.

Sally was known as an expert horse trader. At one time she ran a wagon train from Allegheny to Brownsville. She bought horses in Mexico and drove them to Louisiana. She spoke fluent Spanish, employed Mexican vaqueros and ruled them like a despot.

After the War between the States broke out, she helped the Southern cause by supplying horses, even though it was a business. She lived in many counties in Texas, buying and selling land and horses. She had five husbands.

One biographer thinks she died in 1897 or 1898. It was said with all her faults she was never known to betray a friend.

Maschecks' guest relate history

Guests this past week of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Mascheck were the Arnaldo Berengueres from San Francisco, Cal. Mrs. Berengueres, the former Marjua Palma, is the niece of Mrs. Mascheck.

Two other members of her family are in Manila, Philippines, working for the Spanish Embassy. Mr. Berengueres is the grandson of Arnaldo Comti, opera conductor for the former San Carlo Opera in Milan, Italy. This company toured Europe, South America and the United States. In 1910, while on a tour to the United States, Senior Comti organized the first Boston Opera Company.

His daughter, Amelia Comti, graduated with honors at 15 years of age from the Milan Conservatory of Music as a Harpist, joined her father's orchestra in Boston and later played with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

She met and married Mr. Berengueres there. He was a Spaniard from Barcelona and was a flutist who owned

the first solid gold flute in the world. Arnaldo Berengueres, the son, although imbued with classical music and especially opera, veered toward the diplomatic in his career choice, serving with the U.S. State Department in Central and South America and Europe. Preceding World War II and during that war he served in commercial warfare against the Nazis.

He survived several harrowing experiences against local fascists well organized by the Nazis in Chile, Argentina and Nicaragua. They resented his often successful interruption of their plans. His last post was in Milan, Italy, before retiring from the state department.

The Berengueres were joined in San Antonio by the Maschecks and together toured old historical sites, museums of art, homes of the famous and other points of interest.

A few days later the Maschecks brought the Berengueres to Eagle Lake for rest and a tour of
