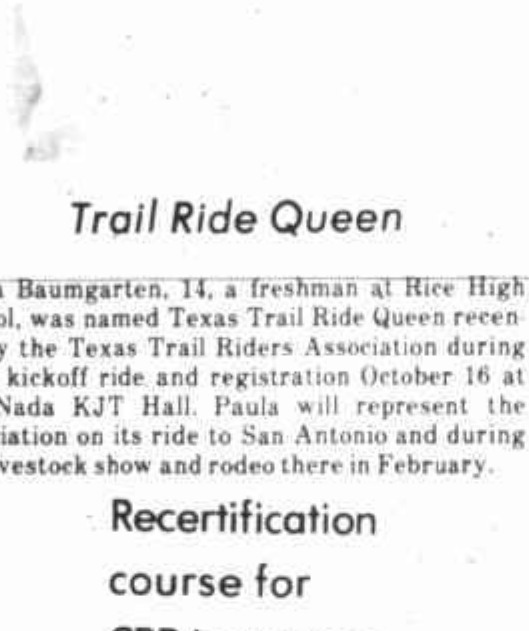
48 Years Ago

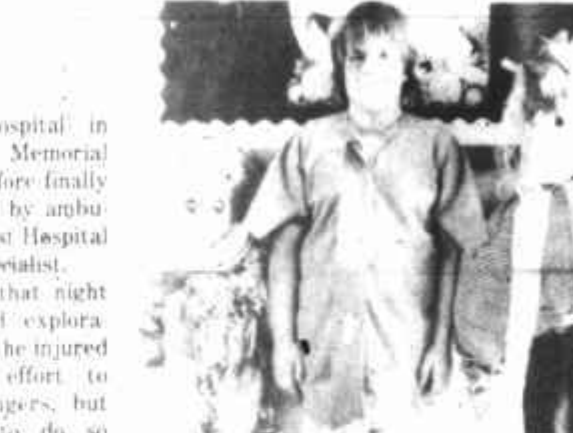
