City sales dip below last year

Sales in Eagle Lake apparently slipped below last year for September, according to the sales tax reports from the state comptroller's office.

Columbus and Weimar continued to show gains. For the year however, the sales reflected by the tax collector are up nearly 10 percent for the Eagle Lake, five percent for Columbus and 30 percent for Weimar. County-wide, year-to-date sales show an 11.8 percent increase.

In September, the one percent share of the sales tax collected means the city received \$21,203.92 this year, compared to \$23,518.83 last September. Columbus was up by \$1,478.28 to \$39,182.97. Weimar's September increase was \$710.18, to 19,325.46.

The one percent tax share means there has been nearly \$50 million of taxable sales made so far this year in the county.
