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Police to issue citations to dog ordinance violators

City Council has instructed the police department to begin issuing citations to owners of dogs violating the city's ordinance controlling the animals.

"The number of dogs (loose), city manager Robert Klockman said Monday, has prompted council to call for this action. At almost every council session for the past several months, at least one councilman has discussed dog control problems.

The ordinance, adopted in 1976, describes a "loose" dog as one that is not under the control of its owner whether the dog is on the

owner's property or not. When a citation is issued, and upon conviction, the fine is \$10 for the first violation, \$20 for the second, \$40 for the third, and \$80 for the fourth.

The ordinance's first section requires that owner of dogs have them registered at the city of offices each year, add that an annual rabies immunization is required before such registration will be issued.

Another section creates the position of "Found Master," or dog catcher, and instructs that person to "take up" any dog found at large, and keep it at the

city pound for at least 72 hours. Owners are notified, if they can be located, and must pay fees to have the animal released. At present, fees are \$5 per day plus \$5 impoundment fee.

Klockman said the city has hired Rufus Tillman, a city employee, as its dog catcher on a part-time basis. However, the city cannot afford a full time catcher, and in the time Tillman has available to help, he can't really pursue dogs as a catcher.

Rather, he sets cages on city property, such as alleys, and with the permission of property owner
