they too did a good overall job, winning over Moulton JV 42-12.

Scorers were Elaine Riggins with 12; Janet Scott with 10; Stephanie Fields with 6; Charlotte King and Debra Stival with 4 each, and Bertie Garcia and Audra Stoval with 2 each.

At the end of the first quarter, Rice led 6-0; at the half it was 16-6 Rice; it was 24-7 at the end of the third period and in the fourth period Rice added 18 more while Moulton added another 5.

The teams played in Brenham on Tuesday.

## Football stats wrap up season

With play for the Rice Raider footballers at an end, season statistics compiled by Joe Fling, with the help of Leroy Alvarado, show that Rob Johnson finished on top for the season in rushing, as expected. But the stats also give some indication as to what might happen next year.

For instance, if coach Clifton Darden chooses to use Mel Pratt as the starting quarterback, statistics show he'll have a seasoned player. Pratt threw 18 passes this season with 39 attempts, for 185 yards, compared to senior Troy Corman who threw for 251 yards on 24 completions with 71 attempts.

Pratt also lead the team this year with four punt returns for 53 yards and scored six points.

On defense, returning Michael Davis was third best this season with 89 total hits, behind Charlie Amos who was first with 142 and Johnson, second with 109.

For those looking for other positive notes next year, five players who can come back accounted for 93 percent of the 647 yards gained on kick-off returns. They are Davis, Pratt, Derrick Thomas, Kenny Johnson and Rodney Parker.

Of course some of next year's starters will come up from this year's junior varsity team, but others who saw action this year will be around too. Michael Mott should be around at tackle. Freshman Tony Hosman, who saw action against Columbus and Bellville, should be around.

In all 19 of the 28 players listed on the roster at the beginning of this season were seniors who will not return.

From the standpoint of how this team performed with others in the short history of Rice High School, Rob Johnson leads all other players with 1,934 yards gained rushing on 122 carries, ahead of Roger Fry who gained 906 yards before he graduated in 1980. Dwayne Pagel ended up

placing fifth in his Rice career with 718 yards; Pratt is 29th and Davis is 42nd.

For pass receiving, graduating senior Phillip Schorlemmer finished first for this season; and in his career, here in 11th place with 272 yards on 19 catches. First place career is Robert Barrios with 945 yards on 54 catches (class of 1980), and Jeff Frnka, 608 on 49 catches (class of 71). Rob Johnson finished second for the season and in 8th place for career.

Johnson also is in first place career for points scored, with 167. Pagel is in a three-way tie for 7th career with 44. Second

place career is Earnest Fields (class of 80) with 114 points.

On Defense, Charlie Amos moved into the top ten for career with 210 total hits, ahead of Kenneth Dankle who graduated in 1977 with 203, and just behind Darrell Davis who graduated in 1975 with 228.

Amos created a new season record for non-linebackers, becoming the first lineman to lead the team in tackles. J. W. Smith had 129 in 1972. Amos is in second place career for non-linebackers.

As for the team, its 1-8 record this year puts Coach Darden's three-year record at 16-12-2.
