The meeting was then turned over to Mrs. Wilcox who introduced her sister and her husband, Dr. and Mrs. Gillespie. Dr. Gillespie with Scott and White Hospital in Temple for many years. They visited the Great Wall which would hold eight horses or five men abreast. Parts of the wall are now being restored. The Gillespies also visited

Madame Chang's Palace. Many beautiful things were in it.

They also showed some work made by hand with almost invisible needles. There is no wrong side to this work which is done mostly by women. The job is so hard on the eyes that every two hours they stop and do eye exercises. One piece was of a dog which was taken from a picture. It took several months to complete at a cost of \$30,000.

The Gillespies were taken on a boat trip and saw the mountains which all seemed to have sharp points, unlike the mountains here.
