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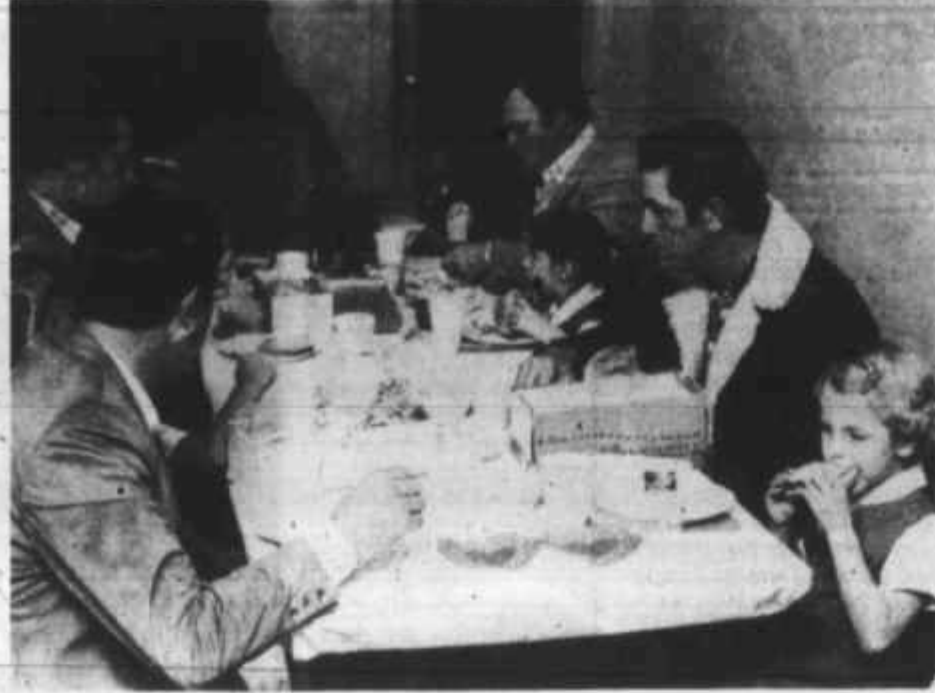

**Tenneco employees mark safety record**

The annual Family Night Safety meeting of Tenneco Oil's Chesterville Plant was held at the Sportsman's Restaurant on January 18.

The event is held each year to honor the employees and their families and to recognize the safety achievements for the Gas Processing Department and the Chesterville plant. The department did not have a lost-time accident during 1982, which also means that the Chesterville plant did not have a reportable accident of any kind during 1982.

The Chesterville plant has not had a reportable minor accident since 1976 and only one lost-time accident since February 1961. In 1971 the employees were awarded the President's Award for 500,000 man hours without a lost-time accident.

Russell Herman is the safety chairman for the plant for 1983 and conducted the program.

Ed Causey, Jr., vice president of the Gas Processing Department, gave a talk on the progress of the department during 1982 and future plans of the department. He also introduced Charles Rampack, senior vice president of Tenneco Oil Company. Mr. Rampack expressed his appreciation for the employees work and their safety accomplishments.

Charley Matchski was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation by Guy Sutherland, operations manager of the Gas Processing Department, for his work as safety chairman for the plant during 1982.

Mr. Sutherland went over the records at other plants as well as Chesterville. He also gave a Tennessee cap to each employee that read "no accident in 1982". He also gave certificates to each employee for having completed a 40 hour operations training program that was held in 1982. Sammy Tise received a certificate as one of the instructors for the training program. This program was put on at the ten plants operated by the department. The plants are located in Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and New Mexico.

Wayne Drusch with the Safety Department of Tenneco Oil presented a program on home fire safety procedures. He also said Tenneco Oil Company is in competition for the prestigious Gas Processing Association industry wide safety award based on the 1982 record that was accomplished.

Retired Tenneco employees present were introduced and also presented with Tennessee caps. They were Wilburn Black, Garner Tate, Martin Roberts and Rublee Drymala.
