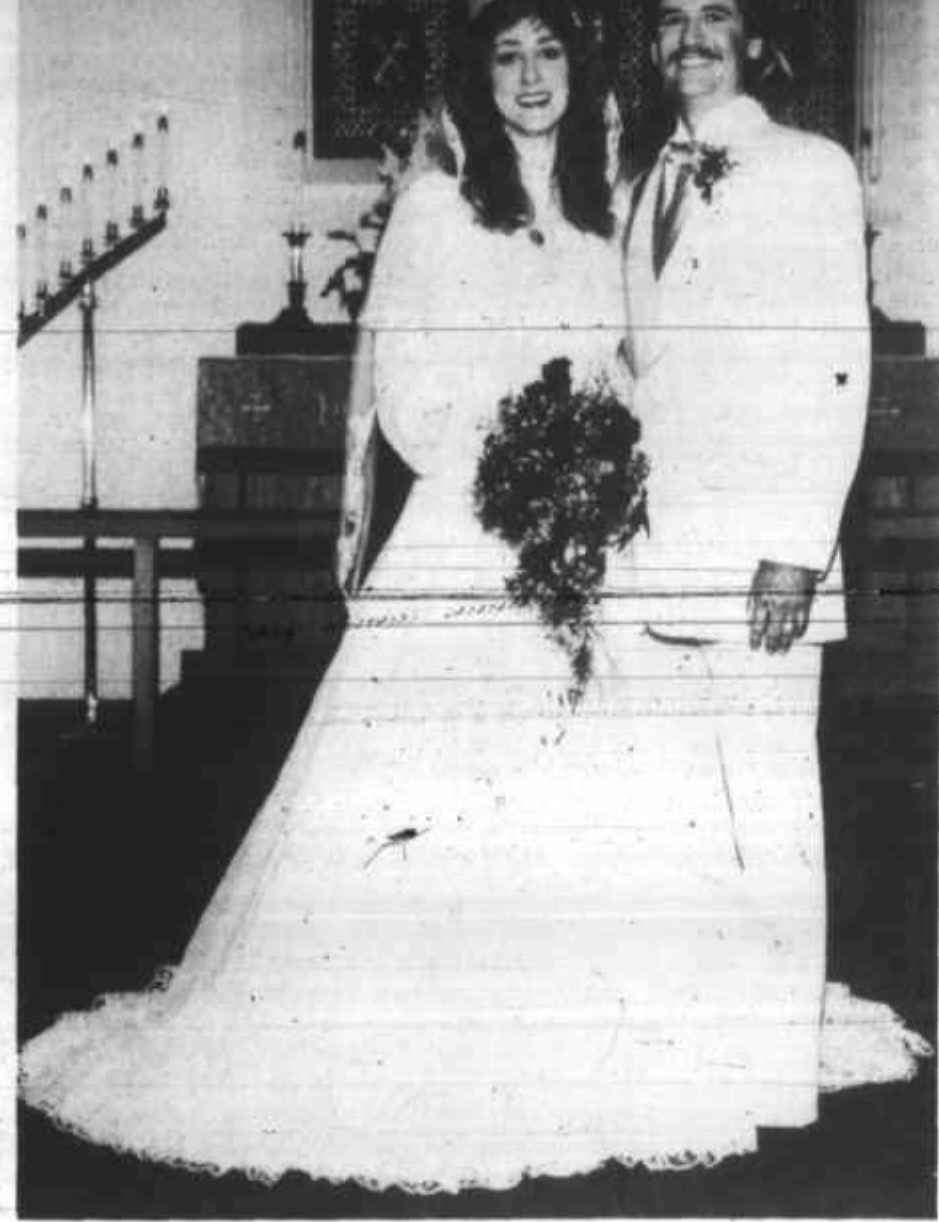

Be sure herds are well fed. Sick animals and cows about to calve should be checked often. A stressed cow is likely to remain a problem mainly during the nighttime hours for the rest of the week, requiring above normal levels of feed and care.

Soils in the Eastern Rice Belt are likely to stay wet for a long period of time. In the drier Western areas, rain returning late in the week will permit only limited field work. Wheat and winter pasture growth will be quite slow the rest of the week.

February outlook

Temperatures during February should be below normal in the Rice Belt, and near normal in the Coastal Bend. Precipitation is likely to be above normal throughout the region. Slow progress on land preparation is expected to continue in the Rice Belt.

For the most part, moisture will be welcomed in the Coastal Bend and should insure good growth of small grains. Cattle care and feeding demands are likely to be higher than usual, especially in the cooler Rice Belt.
