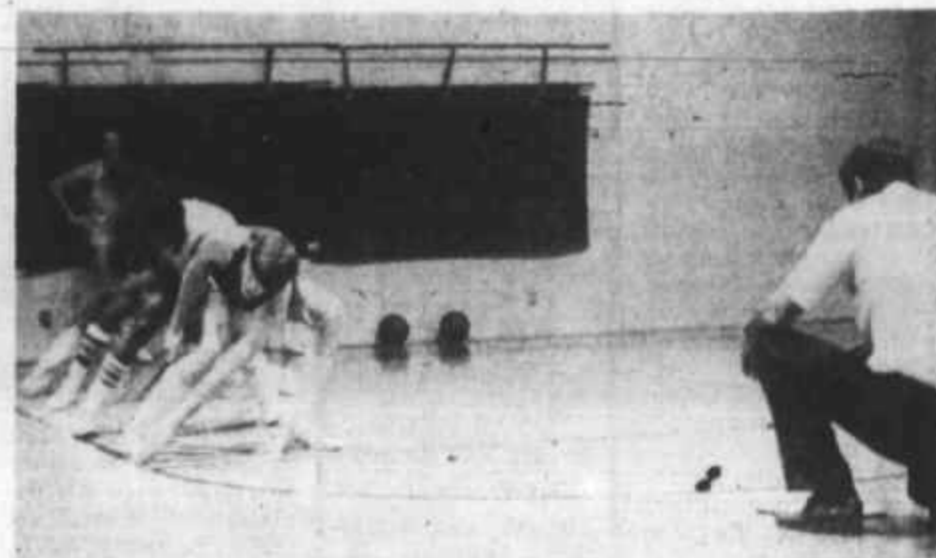
## Raider track, baseball season open

Rice Raider spring sports got underway last week with the track team, under the coaching of Finest Axel, placing second in the Blinn Relays, and the baseball team, coached by Mark Faldys, losing to Edna.

Last Friday at Blinn College in Brenham, Rice competed against 12 teams. They were Rockdale, Hempstead, Thrall, LaGrange, Smithville, Giddings, Brookshire, Royal, Hardin-Jefferson, East Bernard and Sealy.

First place finisher was the team from Giddings. Rice team members won two events, placed second in two others, and scored in a number of other places.

Andy Anderson, with a 159 second time, placed first in the 800 meter, and Phillip Schorlemmer won first in the 300 meter III with a time of 41.17 seconds. Schorlemmer also placed

Tuesday night the team was scheduled to play Fayetteville at Rice High School, and this coming weekend will play in the Weimar Tournament.

Next on the track schedule is a meet in Hallettsville on Saturday, and the following Saturday, March 19, in East Bernard.

## Rice wins grand prix award two straight years

The Rice Consolidated School District won the coveted Grand Prix Award in the Houston Livestock Art Show, and Rice High School student Jerry Fajkus was named the grand champion of the entire show.

Rice entries won the honor in competition with 48 other school districts from throughout the Houston area. No school district has won the Grand Prix Award more than once and Rice CISD became the first school district to capture the award three times. This year was Rice's sixth year to enter this contest. The Rice School District captured the Grand Prix Award in the Houston Show's western art competition in 1979, and finished second in 1980 and again in 1981; and for two

years in a row, 1982-83, brought home the huge first place Grand Prix trophy.

In addition to the honor awarded Jerry Fajkus, Jerry and Thomas Kuykendall were awarded summer scholarships to the Museum of Fine Arts Art School.

The Houston Livestock Art Awards Presentation was held Sunday, March 6 at 4:00 p.m. in the Super Sale Salon of the Astroball. At the presentation, five students from each of the 49 school districts were individually recognized.
