Boys, girls bring home track wins

The Rice High School varsity and junior varsity boys brought home first place wins last week in the 1981 Hallettsville track meet.

The girls team came home in second place in the ten-team competition.

Rodney Parker also brought home a new school record for the 200 meter run.

For the varsity boys, their combined score was 177, 30 points over second place Hallettsville, and more than 100 points ahead of Sacred Heart, Shiner and Bishop Forest.

The junior varsity boys

came in first with 176 points in their division, with Sacred Heart second at 152. Hallettsville and Shiner trailed with 41 and seven points respectively.

For the girls, Hallettsville was in first with 120 points, Rice second at 96, and Gonzales third with 89. The other schools in the events were Cuero, Weimar, Sacred Heart, Bishop Forest, St. Paul, Smithville and Shiner.

In the field events for the boys, events and winners were: shot put, Vincent Dancy placed third and Doug Baumgarten was fif-

th. For Discus, Dancy was first and Phillip Schorlemmer fourth. In the long jump, James Powell won first, Rodney Parker fourth and Ed Thomas fifth. In the high jump, Powell was second.

In the running events, Ed Thomas was first in the 100 meters while Powell was second and Cleve Scott sixth. Rodney Parker ran first in the 200 meters, with his record setting time of 22.1. Powell was fourth.

In the 400 meters, Allen Jones was first, and in the 800 meters, Andy Anderson was first and Allen Jones

second. Anderson's time last week of 1:59.9 was a new school record also in the 800 meters, and was 2:92 seconds faster than this week's time.

Allen Jones placed first in the mile. Schorlemmer won the high hurdles, as well as the intermediate hurdles, and Roger Mienecke placed first in the two mile event.

For the girls, events and winners were: 100 meter hurdle, Becky Bengel, 3rd; 800 meter dash, Becky Kutzer, 3rd, and Kim Wunderlich, 4th; 100 meter

dash, Emelda Clayton, 2nd, and Tracey Davis, 4th; 800 meter relay, the Rice team won first place with Jackie Parker, Emelda Clayton, Tracey Davis and Renia Purdue; 400 meter dash, LaWanda Ware, 4th; 200 meter dash, Renia Purdue, 1st, and Tracey Davis, 3rd, and the 3200 meter dash, Irma Munoz 5th.

Field events were shot put, Kim Wunderlich, 2nd; Discus, Vickie Darden, 4th; long jump, Karen Schneider, 3rd, and Lisa Brown 4th, and triple jump, Lisa Brown, 4th.

The next meet is Saturday at Needville.

Coaches given year to win

Some coaches in the Rice School District learned Monday night they may have only one more year of coaching employment in the district, as Superintendent Harold King made his annual teacher contract recommendations to the board of trustees.

King's recommendations made no mention of several coaches, thus giving them notice they may not have a job here after their present contracts expire at the end of the next school year (1984). Coaches with contracts expiring at the end of this school year were given one more year.

The exception was head basketball coach Jack Grammer who has one year left on his contract, and was given an additional year, as were the large majority of teachers in the entire school system.

King said after the meeting that he "was not satisfied with the athletic program...it's not at the stage we want it to be." He emphasized that the coaches are not being fired. "We will evaluate the program next year," he said.

The superintendent said he felt he was "operating in the framework of what this district wants," and thus he made his recommendations.

What the district wants apparently is a winning sports program, according to King. If we are not here to win ballgames, he said, then why don't we abandon the competitive athletics and run a good intramural program. Under coach Clifton Darden, the football team in only three years

greatly matched the wins of the teams from the ten years before that.

King explained the contract situation. A new coach, who also is a teacher, in the first year can be granted an additional year's probationary contract. A coach in the second year can be granted a two year term contract. Coaches in the middle of their two-year term contract, can be granted a one-year extension, giving them two more years. The same employment situation applies to non-coaching teachers as well.

Although the action applies to the coaching staff, Athletic Director Darden said that since he was responsible for the athletic program, he felt the contract situation was directed mainly at him.

The contracts of the coaches were made to expire at the same time so that if the evaluations next year point to a restructuring of the athletic program and replacing Darden, another athletic director then would have a free reign on employing his own staff.

King told the board that the evaluation program to base future decisions was his area of responsibility, and that he would make further recommendations to the board, rather than ask the board to be an evaluation team. Darden was hired by King three years ago, and was not interviewed by the board at that time.

Last week Darden was told by King what he had recommended to the board, and Darden and other coaches attended the Monday night board meeting. The first 90 minutes of the board meeting was devoted to other school matters, then

the doors to the meeting were closed for an executive session that excluded the audience. Two hours later, the meeting was re-opened to the public; board president Ted Wiese called for a motion, and on a 4-0 vote approval was given to a motion that simply said the board accepted the superintendent's recommendations.

Darden was not question by the board, nor did he ask to speak.

In addition to Darden, coaches that have one more year on their two year contract that were not extended are Finest Axel, Wayne Zimmerhanel, Michael Michalka, Bennie W. Mascher, Vivian Rollins and H. Maurice Gindrat. Coaches granted one year contracts included Dollie Johnson, Robert K. Zander, Gary Wrinkle, Larry D. Varley and Mark E. Faldyn.

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Johnson signs football letter

Rob Johnson on Monday signed a letter of intent to play football for the next two years at Henderson County Junior College.
