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Rice Clinics May 5 in Eagle Lake, Garwood

Two rice clinics will be held in Colorado County on Thursday, May 5 for area rice producers. The 10 a.m. clinic will be held in Eagle Lake at the American Rice Growers Association office. The 2 p.m. clinic will be held in Garwood at the American Rice Growers Association office.

The clinics will be conducted in an informal setting thereby providing rice producers an opportunity to freely discuss their rice production problems. Producers with

problem rice plants and weevil grass problems are encouraged to bring specimens to the clinics for problem diagnosis.

Resource people for the clinics will be Dr. Arlen Klotenboer, Extension rice agronomist and Dr. Glen Whitney, plant pathologist with Texas A&M Research at Beaumont.

This program is a joint effort between the Colorado County Rice and Soybean committee and the Colorado County Extension Service.

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
