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LCRA board gives funds for soil machine

A \$13,673 check from the board of directors of the Lower Colorado River Authority has been used to purchase a new atomic absorption spectrophotometer used in the soil and forage testing laboratory operated by Wharton County Junior College in Wharton.

Farmers, ranchers and homeowners practicing proper soil management programs can utilize the valuable micronutrient determination in soil materials.

Almost 250 soil samples have been checked for micronutrients since installation of the instrument according to Dr. Theodore Nickick, Jr., president of Wharton County Junior College.

"We are grateful to the LCRA Board for their gift and fortunate to have such ample local representation on the authority," states Dr. Nickick. E. B. "Tex" Mayer of La Grange is chairman of the board and Dr. Huebner of Bay City is vice chairman. Board members include M. Jay

Anderson of Cheesterville and John W. Hancock of El Campo. Hancock is chairman of the LCRA Water and Flood Committee and Anderson is vice chairman. Anderson is also vice chairman of the Auditing Committee.

"The cost for micronutrient testing by the spectrophotometer is \$3 per sample and we are aware that returns from testing will not pay for the equipment," says Freddie George, manager of the

LCRA Soil and Forage Testing Laboratory at WCJC.

"However, this is a service wanted and needed by farmers to increase their profit. An increased profit will benefit everyone."

Adequate nutrition today for many crops calls for more than nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium. Micronutrients (zinc, iron, etc.) are equally as vital as the primary plant nutrients. The only difference is the amount. Plants need

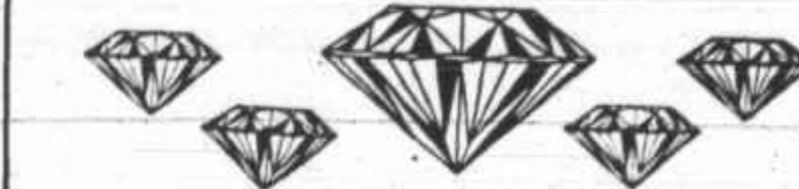
